Objectives:

- To improve the provision of PE at Sevenoaks Primary School.
- To continue to participate in competitions to a high level.
- To broaden the physical activities available to the children, with a particular focus on the pupils in Phase 1.
- To increase participation in sport and physical activity.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- This report will be updated at the end of each academic year to identify the success of the initiatives and the impact that they have had.
- Delivery will be monitored by the PE Leader in the first instance. This will be overseen and managed at senior level by the Head teacher and Assistant Heads.
- We will monitor the take-up of extra-curricular activities.

Monitoring will include observations of teaching, drop-ins to clubs run by school staff, volunteers and outside agencies to ensure that provision is of high quality.
